



### New Business

**NCCC News and Updates:** Governor **Walt Jenkins** reported that there was a fatality at Watkins Glenn due to a faulty seatbelt as was the case in Dale Earnhart's death. **Sean** reminded everyone that this is the reason our club takes so much time and effort when we do tech-inspections before an autocross. Walt also reported that there is still a safety issue concerning closed face helmets when airbags are deployed. He mentioned that the top club received over 12,000 national points. The top man had over 900 points and the top woman also had over 900 points for the year. As a comparison, the CSCC had 111 points for the year. He also announced a proposed rule change for **2008**. Drilled rotors will be allowed for group 2, so you won't have to change out your rotors after that date. Stock and Novice class will be non-competition and will receive no points. All novice class entrants will receive three points, regardless of position and will have to move out of novice class after seven races. Walt stated that if anyone would like to see any rule book changes to please send them to him or Larry Morrison before the National Governors meeting. He also announced that the Regional Convention will be held in Casper WY. again this year in conjunction with an air show. There were two proposed changes to the Rocky Mountain Region By-Laws which were that a change to reserve numbers from 1-15 for the Rocky Mountain Region points champions and the second was to allow Rocky Mountain Region members to reserve numbers for all events. Numbers 16-99 will be available for permanent numbers and there will be no "L" designation for ladies in that group. The Governors voted and approved these changes and will be effective 01/01/06. There will be a Regional Awards banquet which will recognize the top 30 individuals. A blanket nomination was available for officer nominations (regional) for 2006. No nominations were made.

### **Food Bank**

Families and individuals can receive one food box a month. Boxes are based on family size and contain enough food to feed a family for at least three days. Staples which consist of dry beans, rice, powdered milk, flour and pasta are available weekly. Bread, produce and dairy products are distributed whenever available. Each month over 21,000 pounds of food is given away.

### **Back to School**

Many of the families we work with are on a fixed or already tight budget and the cost of school supplies can get quite expensive. We help assist families get school supplies for their children.

### **Economic Support**

Financial assistance is provided for individuals needing help with prescription drugs, in-state bus tickets, or gasoline. Payment is made through the use of a vouchers directly to local vendors.

### **Community Programs**

**Holiday Outreach**—Jointly many Helps Ministries in Fremont County come together to provide Thanksgiving and Christmas food baskets to families. Volunteers throughout the county come out to help make the Holiday Outreach a huge success.



**Christmas Toy House**—Working in conjunction with many other organizations our hope and prayer is that every child will receive a gift at Christmas. Volunteers again are instrumental in making this a success.

**2009 National Convention:** Again, **Walt** reported on the proposal for the 2009 National Convention. **Sean Pazdzior** stated that if we were going to get our bid in for the 2009 convention, that we would have to get started right now. He announced that what we needed to do tonight was elect a Director, a Co-director and possibly a Treasurer from the club, for the convention. He reminded everyone that it would be a lot of work and require some traveling to St. Louis. But that the other clubs in the region would also be helping out. We would like to thank and congratulate the following people for volunteering: Director, **Walt Jenkins**, Co-director, **Tim Greenshields** and Treasurer, **Hal Tumbleson**. Thank you guys for taking on this ENORMOUS task! ## Loaves and Fishes Ministries Programs

### Homeless Shelter

Loaves & Fishes Ministries can house twenty-two plus people and provides a safe environment for families and individuals. It is designed to be a temporary shelter where individuals and families can stay until they become stable. Meals are served three times a day. *(Meals are open to anyone in the community who is hungry.)* Showers and laundry facilities are available for use. Our facilities are totally handicap accessible.



### Transitional Housing

Housing assistance and supportive services are provided to help families and individuals move from homelessness to housing stability and self-sufficiency. Typical supportive services include:

- Case Management,
- Education
- Job Training
- Life Skills Classes
- Financial Counseling
- Substance-abuse Treatment
- Mental Health Services

- Transportation Assistance
- Education Assistance
- Case Management
- Life Skills Training
- Out Reach
- Child Care

### Homeless Prevention Emergency Assistance

These families and individuals are living in Fremont County and have exhausted all their resources in an effort to prevent homelessness.

### Clothing Warehouse

Everything in our warehouse has been donated to us and is given away free of charge to anyone who has a need. We have a large selection of clothing for all ages, furniture, household items, and appliances are available. Items are examined to ensure they are useable before they are placed in the shopping area. On average every month 9,000 items are distributed to families. Our warehouse is operated almost entirely by faithful volunteers who have a heart for helping those less fortunate.

Hi, I would like to introduce to you what I believe our next club charity should be. I have been volunteering at **Mission Medical Clinic** at 2125 East LaSalle. This touches lives across the board. All donations go for medicine, equipment, office supplies, utilities and building maintenance. Everyone is a volunteer. No one is paid. It is a free clinic for low income, uninsured patients between the ages of 18 and 65 who have an address in El Paso and Teller counties. We have regular family practice doctors, a pharmacy and free mail order drugs, a diabetic clinic [with eye doctor, dietitian, & podiatrist], a Psychiatrist, an orthopedic doctor and a therapist. Our patients can see other specialists in their offices free and get free labs at Memorial and Penrose hospitals. We are planning to have dental care also in the near future. We are giving away more than a million dollars of medical care and medicine a year. We have been open for nearly two years. Our building is donated free of charge from Memorial hospital. However, city council wants Memorial to sell the building in the spring of 06. We have the option to buy and are currently weighing what is our best option.

This is one of our miracles in his own words.

Thank you for being there. I went into the hospital in June of 2004 with a heart attack. I was in for three months. I had my own trucking business as an owner operator. I had about \$300.00 worth of medicine in my hand. I heard about Mission Medical Clinic and called them to see if they could help me.

When I walked in, they were the friendliest and the nicest people I had been around in a long time. They took me in to qualify and treated me with kindness and respect. Then I went in to see the doctor and I met one of the finest gentlemen I have ever known. Dr. Gaba is his name. I can't say enough about how great he is. Plus, I got one of the best physicals that I have ever had.

We then went to the prayer room and two people prayed for me and with me. I found this to be uplifting and moving.

The pharmacy filled my medicine needs and when I received them, I met Randy. He is on top of everything. He calls before I run out of something, and let's me know to come in for my prescriptions. Randy is a super guy and a great person to work with. All of the nurses and the people who work at the desks in the offices and in the prayer room are all pro's and very kind.

I really believe that because of God and the Mission Medical Clinic, I am alive today. I want to thank all those individuals and the churches who support the clinic and all the volunteers who work there from the bottom of my heart.
