ADOPT A PLATOON: The NCM has received a request from Major Michael C. Green to approach the Corvette Clubs and the Corvette Assembly Plant on supporting a donation drive for comfort items for the 3rd “Duke” Brigade recently deployed to Afghanistan for one year. Pratt & Miller racing sent two American Flags from the Corvette Racing and Team Cadillac that were flown for a day each at their base in Afghanistan, then returned to the U.S. and subsequently flown at Petit LeMans in Atlanta. Task force Duke’s mission is to assist Afghan National Security Forces and government leaders in conducting counter-insurgency operations, restoring stability and security, and setting the conditions for future transition of governance and security to the Government of Afghanistan. Altogether, the Brigade has just under 5,000 soldiers on the team. Many of them do not have running water, flush toilets, hot showers, etc. The soldiers don’t complain about the lack of amenities, but don’t refuse care packages full of good will. Suggested items include: Snacks – cookies, candy, peanuts; Toiletries – shampoo, shaving cream, razors, deodorant, toothpaste, toothbrush, etc; Books, Magazines, Socks. This does not have to be done immediately, so we can collect items and bring them to the CSCC meeting or can be sent directly. The NCM has started a collection as they are participating as well. The pigment, known as Xirallic, is used in these colors to give a special sheen. The pigment is only produced in a single plant, located in Japan. The earthquake and resulting tsunami damaged the plant, so automobile companies using this particular pigment discontinued the colors.

The Auto-X in Fruita, put on by CWCC, is the first event of the 2011 NCCC competition season. Lorren, Laurie, David, Shuana, Jerry, and I exchanged some frantic phone calls concerned about the weather to/from Fruita over the week end. After conferring with Larry (Governor for CWCC) and verifying there was going to be an event, we left McDonalds in Monument a little after 12:00. It was quite a sight with 3 trailers, and Vette in our caravan. Interesting caravan though, as two trailers went down I25, while the Vette and trailer went down Highway 85 on their way to Fruita.



The weather forecast was snow at Vail Pass, and rain in to morning of the race. Because of the snow and rain:

- Lorren decided to take the 4-wheel truck to haul his Vette instead of the RV;
- Dave had a stripped lug nut on his Z06, so he did not want to swap to street tires, and was concerned about racing with slicks in the rain;
- and I - to get ready for the Racing School and the Burn Out, I put Dick's worn out tires on my street Rims. I discovered that one of Dick's tires has a fast leak. Figured I have to pump the tire up after each race.

Yes, sounds like another race season is about to begin. Although I had quite a problem with sway in the trailer, we arrived at Shauna's mom's house without incident. We had steak,

baked beans, potato salad, and beer for dinner there – a little BBQ. It rained quite a bit that night. In the morning, when arrived at the parking lot,


